It can be a home routine or a school routine: lunedì, martedì, mercoledì, giovedì, venerdì, sabato, domenica</p>	<p>Italian Radio Uno Tune in to Radio Italia Uno 87.6 FM. Listen to the commentator speaking in Italian and see if you can identify any Italian words and write them down in both Italian and in English.</p>	<p>Greetings: Introducing Yourself in Italian.
