Reading

Word Attacker

Your job is to find strange or interesting words on the page. Write them down in your book. Check for the meaning of each word using a dictionary.

To help you find words:

- o Check which words might need clarification
- o Ask your group members to add words to your list
- o Are there any words you haven't heard of before
- o Are there words you don't know the meaning of

WOW!

Questioner

Your job is to write down three questions to test your group members on at the end of the page. You also need to encourage your group members to ask questions to guess what might happen next.

To help you think of questions:

- o You could think of a 'here', 'hidden', 'heart' or 'head' question
- o Find an interesting sentence on the page and base a question around it
