<p>READING</p> <p>Read to a sibling or to yourself.</p> <p>Keep a journal of your reading, making predictions and connections.</p> <p>When finished create a "Tweet" of the story (summary of 140 words) and visual image board of connections to the story.</p>	<p>WRITING</p> <p>Write a chapter book. (orientation, complication, series of events and resolution should be in a chapter separately)</p> <p>Or Write an illustrated children's story with an important message for junior primary students to read.</p>	<p>WRITING</p> <p>Write letters to</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• A friend• A grandparent• A famous person <p>Tell them about your experiences in social isolation, your thoughts and feelings. Also, include something positive to cheer them up. Eg a joke or quote.</p>
<p>WRITING</p> <p>Create a menu for a dinner party at home for your family.</p> <p>Find and record all the recipes and list all the ingredients needed. Make menus/decorations to put on the dinner table</p>	<p>MATHS</p> <p>How much money will you need? Create a shopping list for your dinner party. Calculate the costs to work out the budget for your dinner party.</p>	<p>MATHS</p> <p>Sorting</p> <p>Sort your wardrobe or your parents' wardrobe into either colours or styles. Sort the pantry cupboard to make shopping easier.</p> <p>Find another area of your house that needs sorting.</p>
<p>MATHS</p> <p>DATA project.</p> <p>Conduct a data collection about people in your family eg age, height, birthday, length of feet, hand span, eye and hair colour, circumference of head, neck etc. Think of other data to collect. Make a visual display using graphs about your family.</p>	<p>MATHS</p> <p>Set up a board game challenge for your family. Collect all the games and make a draw eg who versus who. Who will the champion at chess? Who will be the champion of Connect 4?</p> <p>Make awards for the winners and awards for sportsmanship. Have a ceremony to present awards</p>	<p>MATHS/DESIGN</p> <p>Design your dream bedroom. Create a mood board with examples of colours and furnishings. Find the area of your room. Find out the cost of paint and furnishings. Work out a proposal to present to your parents to persuade them to let you change your room.</p>
